Minister's Letter—Lent

By the time you read this magazine, Lent will have started.

The season of Lent was introduced by Pope Felix III in the fourth century as a time of penitence in preparation for the jubilation of Easter. The 40 days of Lent are linked with the 40 days Jesus spent fasting and being tempted in the wilderness. In biblical literature, the number 40 is often used to represent 'a long period of time': the Flood lasted for 40 days and 40 nights, the Hebrew people spent 40 years wandering in the wilderness before reaching the Promised Land, Moses spent 40 days on Mount Sinai with God, before receiving the Ten Commandments.


In western Christianity, Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. Traditionally ashes (often made by burning palm crosses from the previous Palm Sunday) were placed on the heads of believers as a sign of penitence, making the connection with Jesus' conscious decision to turn his face to Jerusalem and go to his death.

The English word 'Lent' is taken from lencten (lengthen), from the Old English word for spring (the time when the days lengthen). The Lenten semi-fast possibly emerged from practical necessity as the previous autumn's harvest began to run out. Since then, self-denial has traditionally been the name of the game in Lent. Many people will give something up, such as chocolate or alcohol, during Lent (and strictly speaking, Sundays don't count as they are not part of the 40 days).

Instead, or as well, sometimes people do something new, often more devotional or helping those in need. I would like to encourage you to attend the Lent Services on Wednesday evenings at Fulneck or the Lent Studies on Monday afternoons at Gomersal (details of both inside this magazine). You could also follow Christian Aid's 'Count Your Blessings' where you can put your faith into action through daily reflections and challenges (www.christianaid.org.uk/lent-easterappeal/count-your-blessings-online). Other similar ideas are also available. And don't forget the Lent Lunches at Fulneck on Fridays.

So, what are you going to do this Lent?

2020 Assessment

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We want to wish you God's richest blessing in your work for 2020.

The PEC appreciates the efforts you make to send in your assessments, which enable us to continue the work of our church. The money your congregation is asked to contribute is used for part of the administration cost and to cover the cost of providing ministers and church workers.

With similar considerations to last year, when we absorbed £39 per member, your assessment this year comes with the PEC having absorbed £75 per member. This means we will have to look to cover part of the cost of ministry from other areas in the

budget. You can well appreciate that in the future we will have to limit the amount of the ministry cost we absorb. Therefore, we have calculated the assessment for 2020 at £410 per member.

We do recognise that some members will be able to give more for the year and we thank them for doing so because some people might not be able to give that much. Giving freely and more than that per capita amount means that your congregation will be better enabled to meet its financial obligations.

Thanks again and may the grace of the Lord be with us all as we work together in his vineyard!
